<u>English</u>



Over the course of the term, children will be developing their comprehension and reading fluency skills using a variety of texts.

Year 5 and 6 will be looking at a range grammar terms in order to structure writing for interest and meaning.

Upper Key Stage 2 will be studying variety of 'Rags to Riches' stories and creating their own story following a similar plot. We will analyse the features of journalistic writing and creating their own newspaper articles.

History - Killingworth Past and Present

This tem we will be finding out how Killingworth and the surrounding areas have changed throughout history. Children will be noting connections, change and improvements over time in relation to our local area. We will continue to present and organise historical information in a variety of ways.

Art- 2D drawings to 3D Making

Children will be exploring food packaging and their designs. Children will create their own designs taking inspiration from the packaging they have researched.

Design Technology - Textiles and Materials
